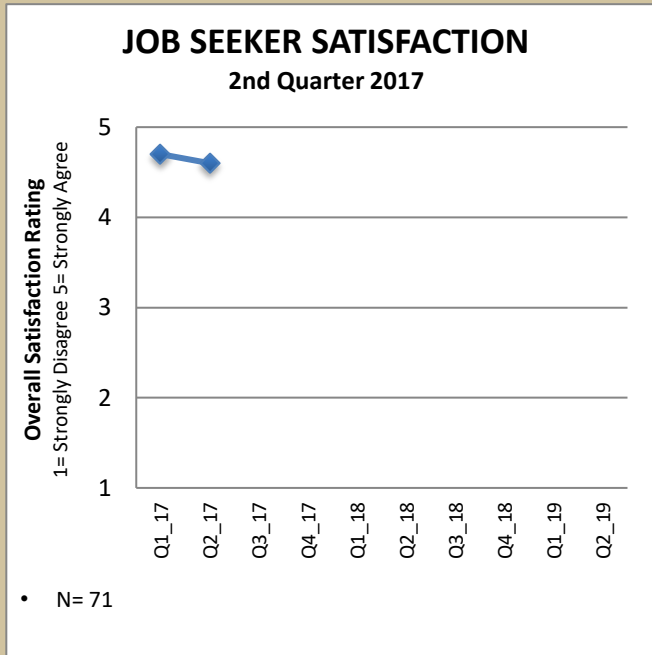

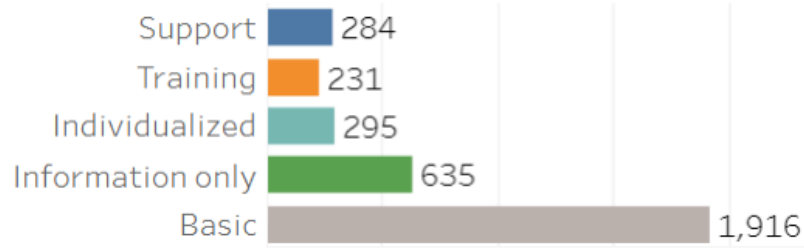

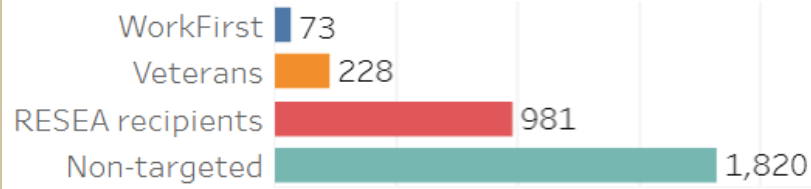


### Staff assisted seekers served by service type\*



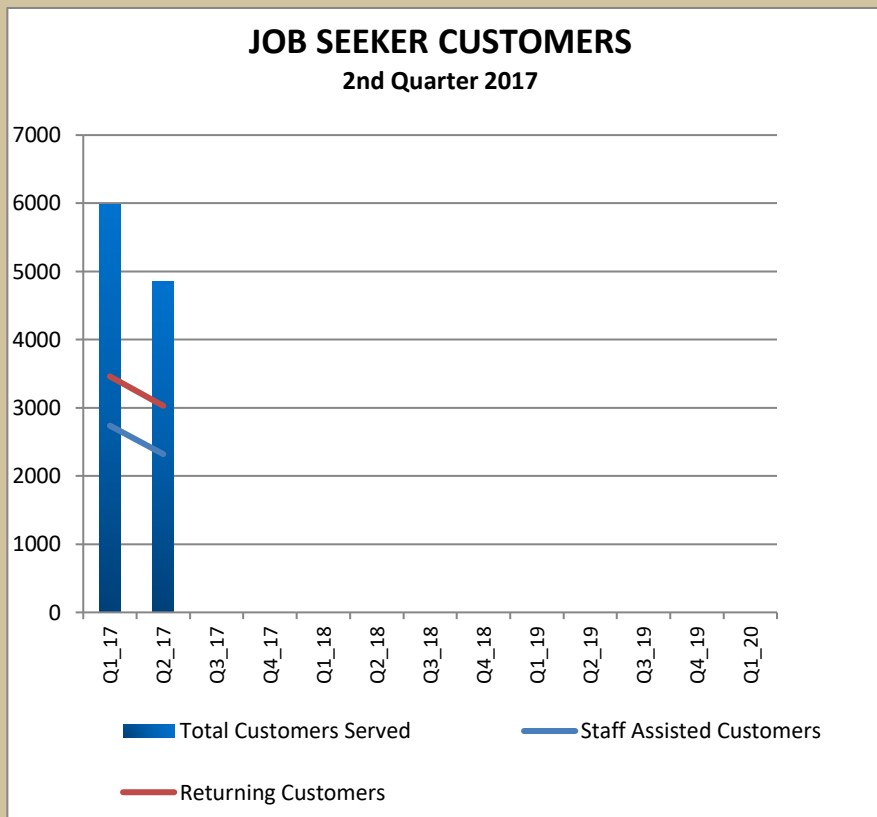
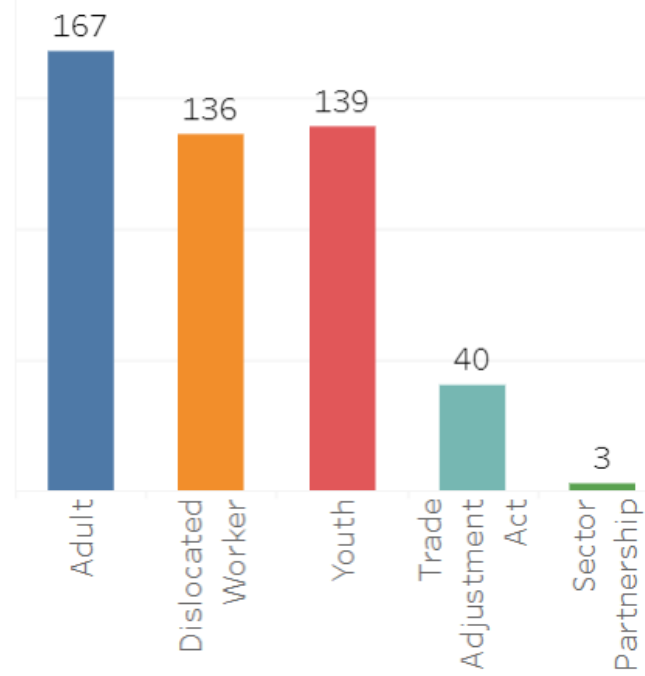

### Staff assisted seekers by cohort

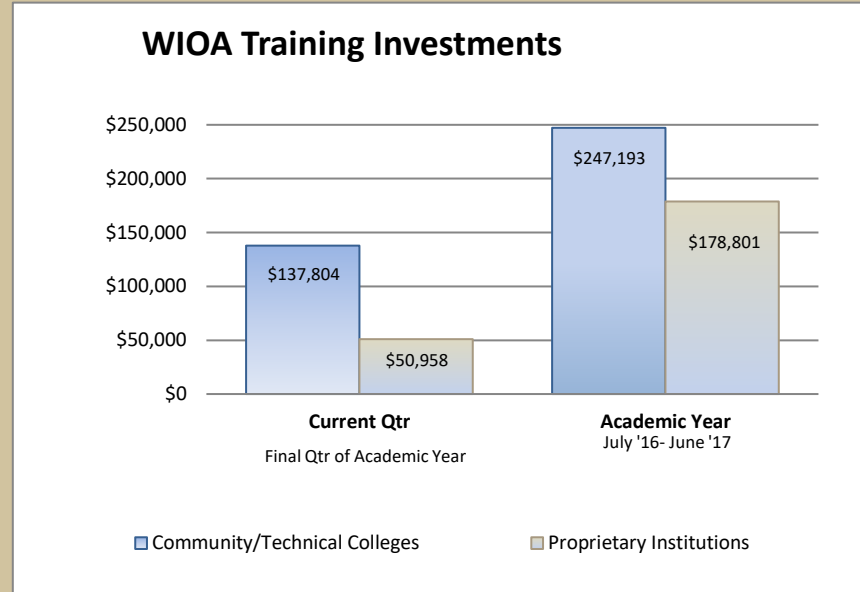
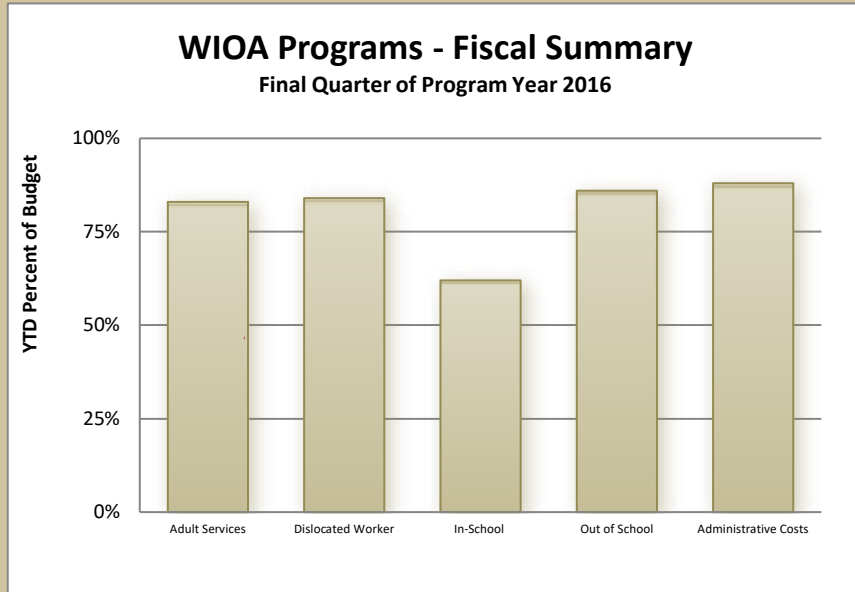


### Seekers served by program enrollment

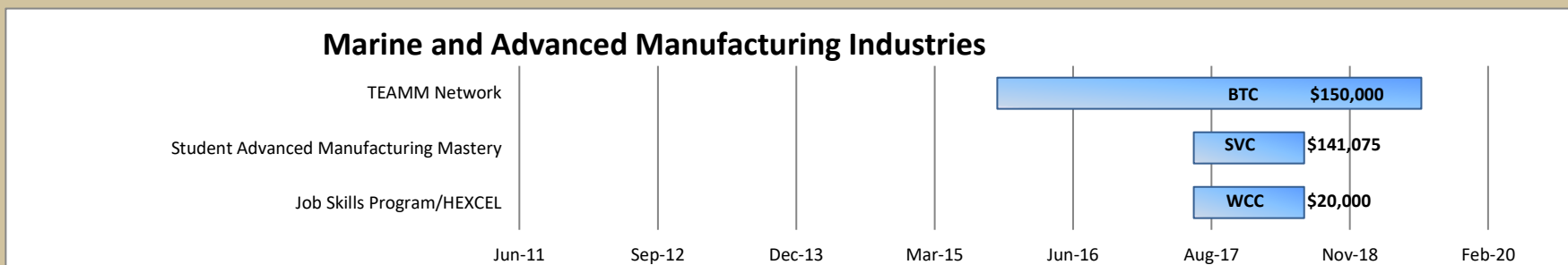
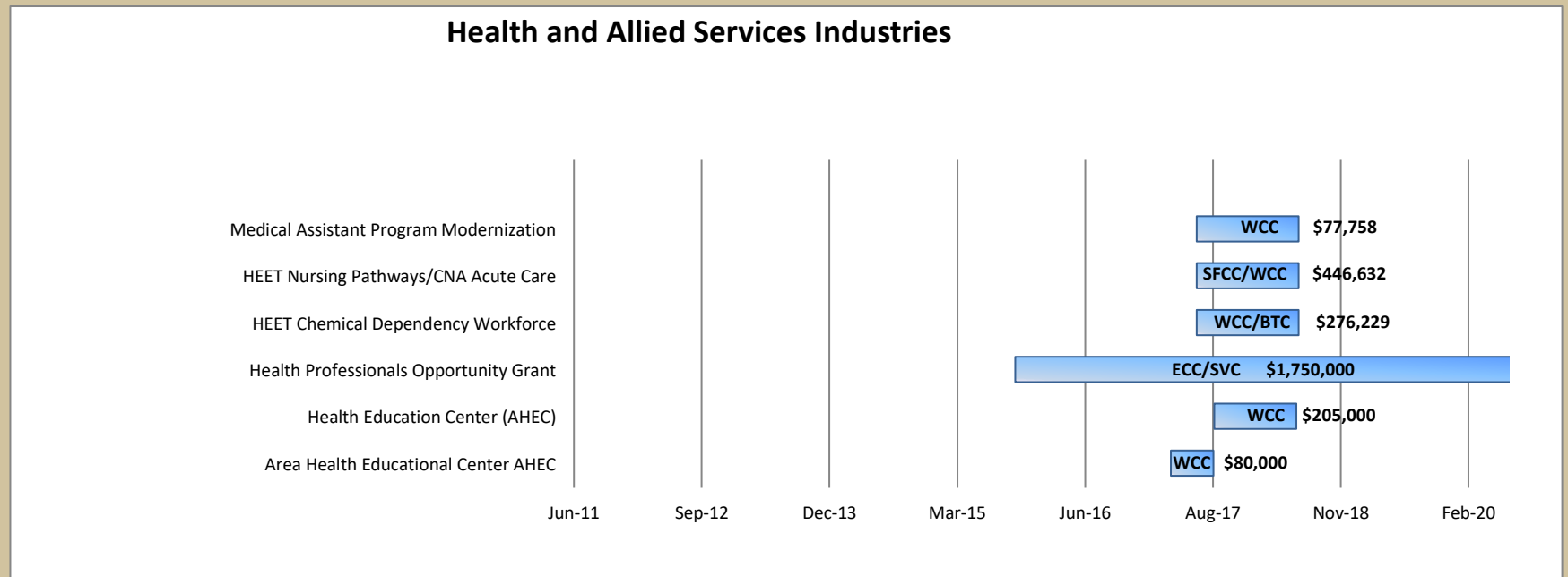
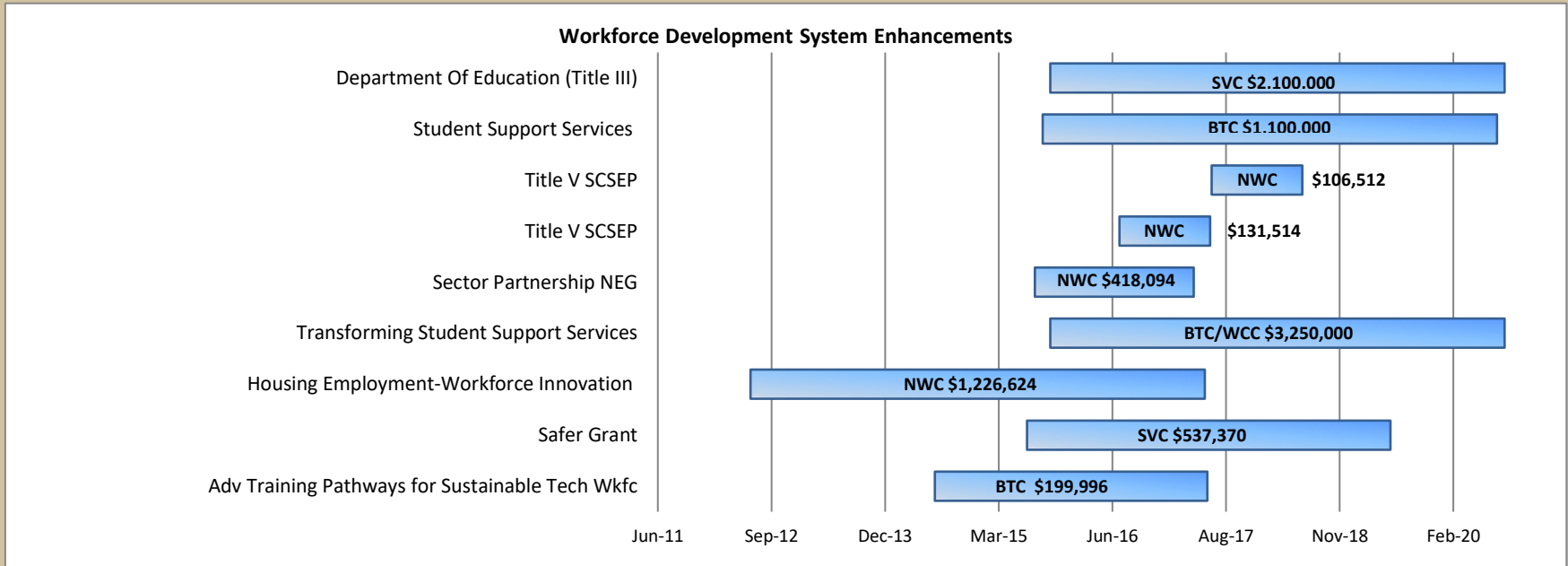
Staff-assisted seeker counts by service location, regardless of enrollment location

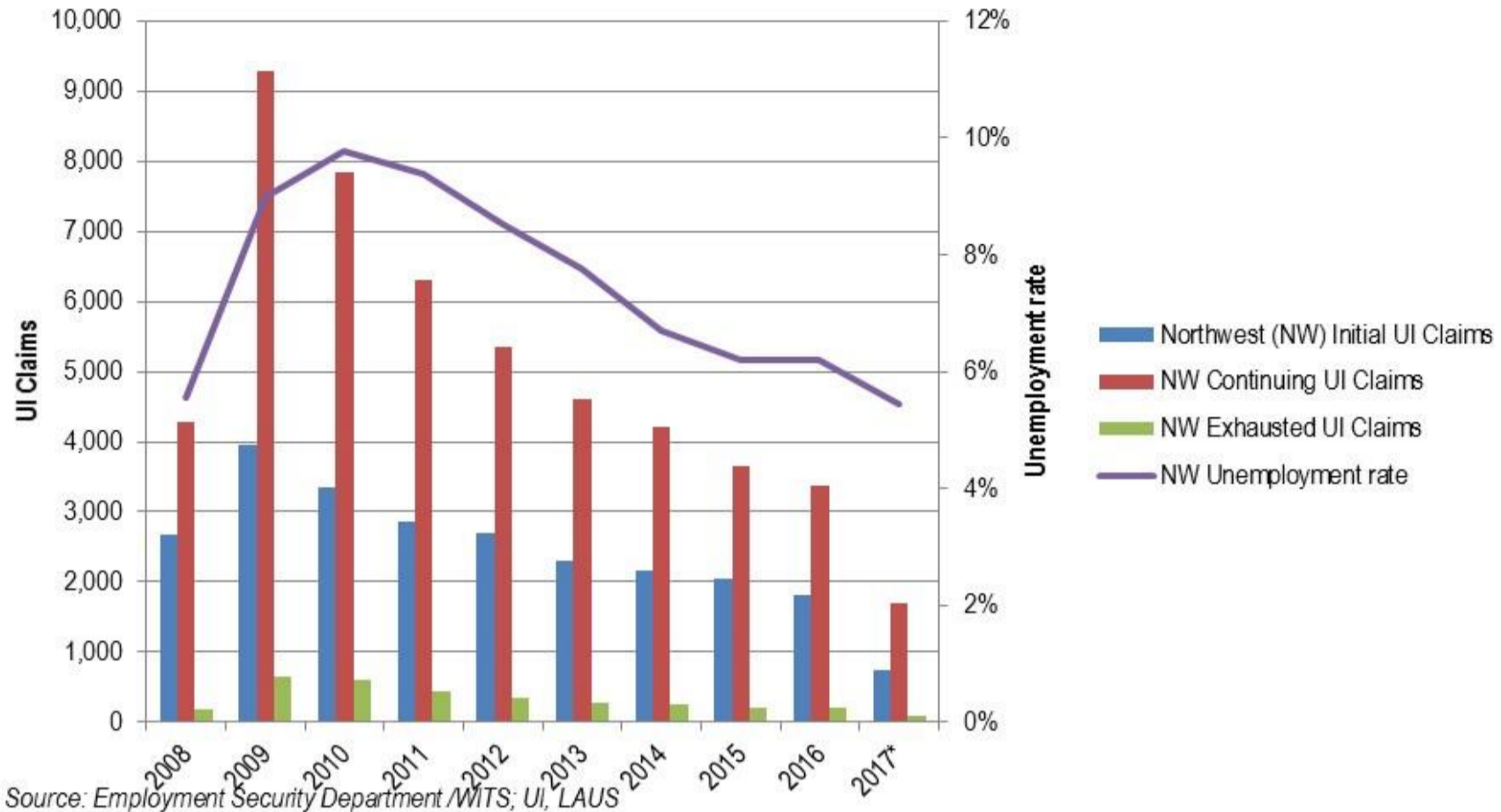

## Northwest Workforce System Performance

### Northwest Average Monthly Unemployment Insurance (UI) Claims and Unemployment Rates, 2008 - 2017



UI claims and labor force information (including the unemployment rate) available through June 2017.

Unemployment insurance claims have been declining each year since 2009.

After reaching a peak in 2010, the unemployment rate has been on a slow and steady descent.

In 2016, a total of 1,823 Northwest residents filed new UI claims and 197 exhausted regular UI benefits.

The average number of continuing UI claims in 2016 was 3,377--down from 3,644 in 2015.

In June 2017, the not-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Northwest was 4.9% compared to 6.1% in June 2016.

The 4 counties in Northwest WDA share a common regional labor market, but have recovered differently from each other.

In June 2017, Skagit County had the highest rate (5.1%) followed by Whatcom and Island (4.9%).

San Juan County had the lowest unemployment rate in Washington state (3.4%).

The NW laborforce contracted in the recession, expanding in 2015.

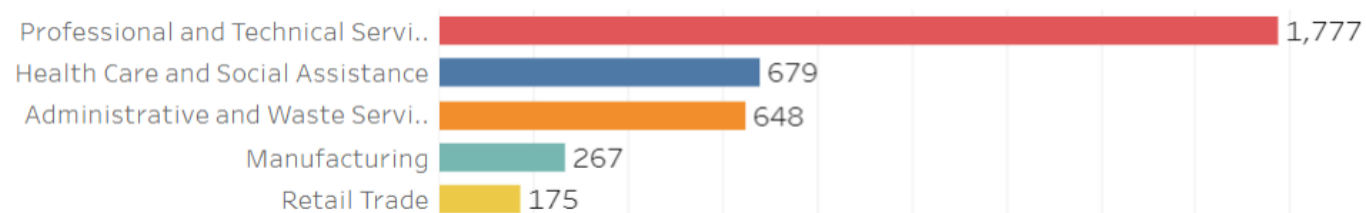
The average annual '16 laborforce was estimated at 206,551 resident civilians.
