


Rehab. Rate: % of customers with closed case after successful plan achievement.



Data from rolling 4 qtrs including PY Qtr 1 (July-Sept '15)








## **Northwest Workforce System Performance**




UI claims and labor force information (including unemployment rate) available through December 2015.

- Unemployment insurance claims declining each year since 2009.
- The number of Unemployment Insurance claims in 2015 was lower than the number observed in 2014.
- After reaching a peak in 2010, the unemployment rate has been on a slow and steady descent.
- In 2015, a total of 18,470 Northwest residents filed new UI claims and 2,328 exhausted regular UI benefits.
- The average number of continuing UI claims in 2015 was 3,644, down from 4,203 in 2014.
- In December 2015, the unadjusted umemployment for the Norhtwest was 6.2 %, compared to 7% in December 2014.
- In 2015, the labor force expanded by 1,405 residents or 7%.
- In December 2015, Skagit County had the highest unemployment rate (6.8%), followed by Island County (6.2%), and Whatcom County (5.9%). San Juan County had the lowest unemployment rate (4.9%).
